Sight Reading and Comprehension

15 Marks

This section comprises of three sections (sight reading, theory and comprehension).

Sight Reading

A short passage of moderate difficulty, hands together in the major and minor keys of:

Major Key: C, G, D, A, F, B flat or E flat
Minor Key: A, E, B, F sharp, D, G or C









Theory

The examiner will ask questions in relation to any of the candidates prepared pieces.

Name and Explain: As previous grades including dynamics, articulation, mood, tonality, performance directions and style.

Identify: Major and minor chords in root position, first inversion and second inversion.

Identify: Major, Perfect and minor intervals (harmonic and melodic).

Identify: Perfect and Imperfect cadences in prepared pieces.

Comprehension

Describe: Background information about the composers of their prepared pieces at the request of the examiner. (i.e. date of birth, birthplace, types of compositions/works).

Aural Observation <u>10 Marks</u>

The aural observation comprises of two sections (observation and memory)

Observation

To listen to a short piece played once by the examiner and to comment on the tonality of the piece, variations of dynamics, tempo changes and articulations.





To recognise a rhythmic or melodic change in a four bar melody in a major or minor key played twice by the examiner (i.e. did the change occur in the first or second bar). The change will be made in the second playing.





Melodic change





Memory

Clap back from memory the rhythm of a short melody in simple or compound time, and state the time signature as either simple duple, simple triple, simple quadruple or compound duple. The passage will be played 3 times by the examiner and the pulse will be given at the beginning of the piece.



Having identified the time signature the candidate will be asked to identify note values within one of the bars.

To perform three pieces – There is a maximum of 20 marks per piece - See following page for details.

Technical Studies <u>15 Marks</u>

Candidates can choose Scales and Arpeggios or Graded Piano Studies to fulfil the requirements for Technical Studies.

While technical exercises are optional, scales play an integral part to a candidate's development.

Scales and Arpeggios

All scales and arpeggios to be prepared hands together at the examiner's choice. All scales and arpeggios are to be played legato or staccato from memory. Suggested metronome mark - Scales: crotchet = 88 and Arpeggios: crotchet = 72

To be prepared legato and staccato.

Similar Motion Major: C, D, E, F sharp, B flat and A flat Four Octaves

Harmonic Minor: C, D, E, F sharp, B flat and A flat Four Octaves

Melodic Minor: C, D, E, F sharp, B flat and A flat

Four Octaves

A Third Apart Major: C and G Two Octaves

Harmonic Minor: C and G

To be played legato only.

Contrary Motion Major: C, D, E, F sharp, B flat and A flat Two Octave

Harmonic Minor: C, D, E, F sharp, B flat and A flat

In root position and first inversion, legato only.

Arpeggios Major: C, D, E, F sharp, B flat and A flat Four Octaves

Minor: C, D, E, F sharp, B flat and A flat Four Octaves

Chromatic Beginning on any note Four Octaves

Chromatic Legato Only. Two Octaves

Contrary Beginning on D or A Flat

 Dominant 7ths
 Root Position
 Two Octaves

 To be played In the keys of: C, D and E
 To be played In the keys of: C, D and E

Diminished 7ths Similar Motion Two Octaves

To be played in the key of: C



This section comprises of three sections (sight reading, theory and comprehension).

Sight Reading A short passage of moderate difficulty, hands together in any major and minor keys of:







Theory

The examiner will ask questions in relation to any of the candidates prepared pieces.

Name and Explain: As previous grades including dynamics, articulation, mood, tonality, performance directions and style.

Identify: Major and minor chords in root position, first inversion, second inversion and third inversion.

Identify: Major, Perfect and minor, augmented and diminished intervals (harmonic and melodic).

Identify: Perfect or Interrupted cadences in prepared pieces.

Comprehension

Describe: Background information about the composers of their prepared pieces at the request of the examiner. (i.e. date of birth, birthplace, types of compositions/works).

Aural Observation <u>10 Marks</u>

The aural observation comprises of two sections (choice observation and memory)

Observation Candidates can choose one of the following Aural Observation or Harmonisation:

ObservationTo listen to a piece played by the examiner and to answer questions on the tonality of the piece, variations of dynamics, tempo, tempo changes, graduations of tone, articulations and recognition of tonality as major or minor.




Questions to Include:

- (i) Describe the opening bars; dynamics etc.
- (ii) Are there any tempo changes in the piece?
- (iii) Describe the ending: e.g. dynamics, tempo changes etc.


OR

Harmonisation

To indicate suitable chords for a series of five notes in the treble at the keyboard. In the major keys of C, G, D or F.



To harmonise a perfect or interrupted cadence in the major keys of C, G, D or F.



To compose an answering phrase to a given two bar melody in the major key of C or G.

Memory

Clap back from memory the rhythm of a four bar phrase in simple or compound time, and state the time signature as either simple triple, simple quadruple or compound duple. The passage will be played 3 times by the examiner and the pulse will be given at the beginning of the piece.







Having identified the time signature the candidate will be asked to identify time values within the same passage.

To recognise a triad as major or minor, root position or first inversion.



To recognise a cadence as either perfect or interrupted
