Job Summary:

The lecturer is primarily responsible for the delivery and assessment of assigned modules and is expected to play a very active role in the academic direction of students' learning and development including teaching, learning, assessment and administration.

Job Responsibilities:

- Deliver assigned modules in the field of computing science
- Work proactively in improving existing modules and provide feedback and guidance to the learners and Programme Director at the end of each academic term.
- Engage with the Programme Director on a regular basis and address concerns in a timely manner.
- Carry out assessment, monitoring and evaluation of examination and coursework, and provide this information to the Programme Director.
- Aid learners, with course content as required and in a timely manner.
- Participate in internal faculty meetings as required.
- Follow and adhere to the college's QA policies and procedures.

Programme Content:

- Formally review modules at the end of semester / academic year and provide feedback to the Programme Director
- Participate in the development, implementation and maintenance of academic quality assurance policies
- Maintain the academic integrity of the computing courses.
- Liaise with lecturer counterparts day/evening/GC centres etc as suggested by the Programme Director
- Manage the delivery and possible development of course syllabi as prescribed by the approved programme documents and guided by the Programme Director

Teaching Role and Assessment Marking:

- Deliver such assigned lectures/tutorials as deemed appropriate by the Programme Director and Head of Faculty, day/evening/blended and in line with Programme goals and learning outcomes

- For each module you are teaching, you are required to prepare, correct and submit all assignments and examination scripts in a timely manner.
- Review student queries regarding coursework, exams, grades, etc
- Be available for respective subjects during examination periods and attendance at course board meetings which occur three times a year in May, August and January.
- Staff Attendance at Graduation.

Administration:

- Participate in the administration activities in the faculty as assigned by the Programme Director such as attendance taking,
- Work with the faculty administrators/Programme Directors and undertake necessary admin checks while submitting students' work
- Participate in Open Evenings and other College promotional events as required by the Programme Director
- Provide annual programme review input to the Programme Director and Head of Faculty
- Provide efficient use and updating of the module of the E-Learning Management System.
- Any other duties that fall within the employee's capabilities.

Minimum Education/ Experience Requirements:

- Overall the successful candidates will be expected to make a significant contribution to the teaching profile of the College
- Have relevant industry experience
- Possess a Level 9 postgraduate qualification in Computing Science
- Be highly organised with meticulous attention to detail.
- Have excellent interpersonal, written and verbal communication skills.
- Be committed to educational quality and customer service.
- Willing to work effectively as part of an integrated team in the Computing Faculty
- Hold a Teaching and Learning qualification, if not, the applicant will be required to undertake the College's level 9 Training & Education programme on appointment.
- Must be legally entitled to work full time in Ireland for any employer.
